
Using PhET simulations for Physical Science for Middle School

The PhET project provides a free website of simulations that are designed to support student learning. We have simulations like Salts and Solubility, Gas Properties, Reactions and Rates, Moving Man and Forces 1D. This workshop will help you design effective lessons and use lessons that other teachers have shared. The PhET team has designed a set of guidelines that help teachers integrate the simulations into lessons using guided inquiry. We will help you use these guidelines to provide activities for students to construct their own understanding of chemistry ideas.
